Artistic Development Grant Application

The Spring Green Area Arts Coalition mission statement affirms that SGAAC “strives to build enthusiasm for and accessibility to the arts so they become meaningful, irresistible and indispensable to each of our 10,000 residents/ constituents.” The purpose of The Artistic Development Grant is to promote artistic learning, projects and development within our community.

1. Applications must be completed and submitted by February 24, 2020.

Email submission is highly encouraged.

2. A public meeting of the grant review panel will be held mid-March, 2020 (exact time and place TBA). Applicants are encouraged, but not required, to attend. Applicants may not make a statement or presentation about the project. The panel may ask the applicant clarification questions.

3. The recommendations of the review panel will be presented at the meeting of the SGAAC Board of Directors following the Panel Review.

4. Applicants may appeal decisions made by the review panel for procedural error or conflict of interest only. Appeals must be filed with SGAAC within ten days of grant award announcements.

Responsibilities of Grantees

Grantees who are unable to complete their project for any reason must return all funds to SGAAC upon request.

Eligible Projects

- Artistic projects
- Short-term courses pertaining to an artistic field of interest of the applicant (short-term is defined as fewer than 15 class sessions; workshops art/music camps are eligible.)

Awarded funds may not be applied to college tuition for regular classes where the applicant is attending. Short-term courses offered by a college are eligible. Awarded funds may cover: course registration fees (tuition/workshop), time/stipend, materials, and travel.

Eligible Applicants

Any professional, amateur, or student artist serving the River Valley School District (Spring Green, Lone Rock, Arena, Plain) is eligible to apply.

Artistic Development Grant Requirements

Criteria

The following criteria will be evaluated for project grant proposals:

- * Potential for the applicant's growth and development
- *Community benefit (Awardees will be asked to demonstrate, exhibit or present at a SGAAC event.)
- *Artistic merit and/or innovation
- *Ability of the applicant to successfully complete the project
- *Ability to provide a portion of the funding
- *Project/class completion date: January 31, 2020

Grant Amounts

Grant maximum is \$2,500. Applicants should demonstrate financial commitment to their project.
SGAAC will not fund the entire cost of any project.
